Adelphi University admits its first batch of students to the Doctoral program in Clinical Psychology in 1950. The next year, Gordon F. Derner was invited to become Director of Clinical Psychology Training. The Gordon F. Derner Institute of Advanced Psychological Studies became the nation's first university-based professional school of psychology in 1971.

Scope and Content of the Collection

The renowned Gordon F. Derner Institute for Advanced Psychological Studies at Adelphi University has been training doctoral level psychologists for over 50 years. The Derner Alumni Collection showcases scholarly work produced by these alumni since leaving Adelphi.

Launched in 2015, the Derner Alumni Collection is a developing collection. As it grows, it will encompass the wide range of topics addressed by psychologists.
